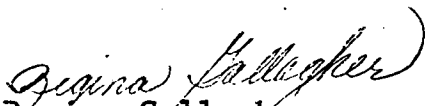

The following composite samples of Vermont 66 talc have been analyzed by (1) continuous scanning x-ray diffraction for qualitative mineralogical composition (2) slow scanning x-ray diffraction for the presence of amphibole minerals (CTFA Method J4-1) and (3) differential thermal analysis for the presence of quartz (CTFA Method J5-1) and serpentine minerals:

1/17 - 1/21/77	2/14 - 2/18/77
1/24 - 1/29/77	2/21 - 2/25/77
1/31 - 2/4/77	2/28 - 3/5/77
2/7 - 2/11/77	3/7 - 3/12/77

The samples appear to be typical of Vermont 66 talc samples previously examined; chlorite levels approximating those of pre-1976 composite talc samples.

No quartz, serpentine or amphibole minerals were detected in these samples.
