I am enclosing herewith copy of the proposed license to manufacture Careycel type of insulation and Careycel paper for your consideration and comments.

As I understand it under the proposed schedule some of the insulation is to be a laminated Careycel type and in order that there may be no question about the rights of your licensees to make that type of covering, if they propose to use indented paper such as Careycel is made from, I presume they should also be offered a license from us at or about the time they execute the license with you. What suggestion have you to make in this connection? Possibly you should have copies of this license to present to the manufacturers on our behalf (as we would, of course, only grant licenses to manufacturers) at the time you present the license under the Toohey patent.
