I do not consider myself at liberty to supply the Texas Company with a copy of my letter to Dr. Bonnard Teegarden. My relationships with him were of a somewhat personal and professional nature, and he gave me very freely all the information which I requested. I should not feel free to release this information without his permission as a matter of professional courtesy. However I am writing to him today, mentioning the request of the Texas Company, and if he has no objection, I am quite willing to pass along the information to the Texas Company at a later date. It is quite conceivable that he himself will be quite willing to give the Texas people any information which they desire. However I can not answer for him in this regard and I suggest, therefore, that you notify the Texas people that I shall be glad to comply with their request if and when I obtain Dr. Teegarden's consent.
