In response to your letter of April 30, I believe the following could answer your questions:

1. We are using the same formula for bedding and topping with the following identification number - 617-6489-7891 R & D 347.

2. We are using the same formula for bedding and topping and we recognize the things: a) It is impossible to formulate a product that would make corrections resulting from variation without the result of field tests. The formula is what you test the requirements that we try to formulate for each of these products. Any further changes to either product have to be based on field experience. b) Using the same formula for the trial products will require less of your valuable attention time.

3. You can use your own judgment in the type of bag to use. Our feelings were that if we could successfully introduce this product in SRA bags, it would be a way to utilize the bags that Akron and Chicago have in stock.

4. The formula is a vinyl adhesive based product. It would be compatible with your Triple Duty or Steady Mix filler but not with your resin product.

5. The specification for genriv 492S is raw material specification number 223 (dated 12/13/70).

6. We are in the process of investigating raw material test methods for Attoral 5. We will send the specification out as soon as it is finished. The specification will set the following standards for acceptance:

a) Particle Size:	<u>Minimum</u>	<u>Average</u>
-50 mesh	100.0%	--
-100 mesh	99.9	99.99%
-200 mesh	99.5	99.90
-325 mesh	99.0	99.70

b) Material should be free of grit and hard lumps.

c) Color: light cream (variable)

Should also be noted that in addition to replacement of asbestos, the material would have an approximate raw material cost of \$.35 per lb. for the casing topping.
