TWO REPRINTS ON THE LEAD HAZARDS TO CHILDREN

We have obtained a limited number of copies of the following publications:

American Standard Specifications to MINIMIZE HAZARDS TO CHILDREN FROM RESIDUAL SURFACE COATING MATERIALS. This is ASA Standard Z66.1-1964, which is a revision of the previous standard dating from 1955. The Subcommittee which prepared this standard was under the Chairmanship of our good friend R. J. Eckart of Epolin Paints and your Health and Safety Director acted as Secretary. The changes that have been made in this revision are mainly in the wording of the standard, although suggested methods of analysis for lead and mercury are included. There is no change in the specified amount of lead which shall be used in paints for furniture, toys or interior use in houses--1% limit.
