seriously injured in Diego explosion

DIEGO, Sept. 12 (AP)—A gas explosion in a neighborhood liquor store here today resulted in serious injuries to at least two persons, injured several others and started a fire which spread to an adjacent apartment house, market and cafe.

A two-story building housing the apartment house and market collapsed, but Fire Marshal Newton said the seven occupants believed to have been in the apartments had escaped, one by leaping from a second-floor window and landing on the ground.

Newton said the wreckage was being searched for possible bodies, but one has been reported missing.

Witnesses said the blast, which rocked the neighborhood, "might have been caused by escaping gas."
