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As regards the type of service which the Republic Steel now gets from our Industrial Hygiene Laboratory, there are other places from which this type of service can be purchased. An incomplete list would include:

1. The Industrial Health Foundation of Pittsburgh
2. The Kittering Laboratories of Cincinnati
3. The Saranac Laboratories at Saranac Lake, New York
(I believe they have been doing some work for Republic Steel, which Republic Steel does not consider too satisfactory.)

Some limited industrial health services are also available from the Industrial Hygiene Division of the U. S. Public Health Service. This service is given without charge. On the other hand, the Service reserves the right to publish the results.

Another future probability is the laboratory being started by Dr. Lanza at New York University. Just what its scope and facilities will be are not yet determined.

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If Republic Steel purchased service from an organization like the Industrial Health Foundation, we could at the same time review the reports and give them our endorsement through Dr. McConnell's office. This would give the findings a sort of double scientific and impartial background.
