TO: All Members of the LIA Health and Safety Committee

RE: Revisions in Threshold Limit Values

Enclosed is a notification of intended changes in Threshold Limit Values for 1971. Please note the intended reduction of the TLV for lead from 0.2 mg/m^3 to 0.15 mg/m^3 .

If any member has information pertinent to this change, we would appreciate your making it available to LIA so that we may formulate our position on the change. Naturally, we would also be grateful for your opinion as to the justification of the change and its impact on the industry.

This notice takes on special importance in view of the signing of the Federal Health and Safety Act by the President on December 29. This act empowers the Secretary of Labor to set standards for occupational health and provides for enforcement by Federal Inspectors. It is likely that Threshold Limit Value will, at least initially, serve as standards.

1971 NOTICE OF INTENDED CHANGES

This Notice of Intended Changes is published so that industry-connected individuals principally, but others also, may have an opportunity to help shape the deliberations of the Committee prior to its recommendations of tentative changes in the 1970 Threshold Limits List. This can be done by submitting to the Chairman comments on the intended changes, with supporting data, or by submitting new data on substances not within the Notice.

This Notice is not binding on the Committee to place all substances listed below in the 1971 Edition, nor does it restrict the Committee to these substances; substances with appropriate supporting data received following the publication of this list will be considered at the next Committee meeting for inclusion in the 1971 Edition. This Notice indicates only those substances that are under consideration by the Committee. As documentation becomes available, requests for such documentation will be honored for those substances bearing a threshold limit value in this Notice. Those substances listed without a TLV originated from requests of the Committee during the year, but for which the Committee lacked information to recommend a TLV. Thus, such listings serve notice of the need for toxicologic information on these substances.

All toxicologic information supporting a new TLV or revision of an old Limit should reach the Chairman by March 15, 1971. Address: Dr. Herbert E.
