Dear Dr. Kehoe:

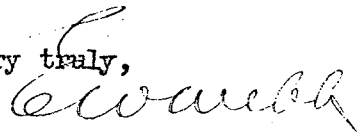
I have your letter of the 11th and think it would be very much more satisfactory if you could meet me in Chicago and take up the question of the mixing equipment matter with the accredited officer of the Standard Oil Company (Indiana).

You probably know that Mr. Beaumont Parks died on a recent trip to South America, and so far as I know his successor has not been appointed although it is probable it has been done without the matter being brought to our attention.

You may recall that Dr. Humphries was his assistant, and I feel sure that he has always entertained a sympathetic attitude toward our point of view. I happen to know that Mr. Stephens, General Counsel of the company, and Mr. Allan Jackson are strong in the faith of full and complete cooperation with us on this subject. However, it would be better to get it through the channel with which we will have to work hereafter, namely, the successor to Mr. Parks, although I rather suspect that on my visit to Chicago I will have the opportunity to prepare Mr. Stephens to come to our support if any be required in getting our recommendations adopted.

Enclosed is copy of letter I am sending today to Dr. Humphries. I will be pleased to communicate with you the moment I hear from him.
