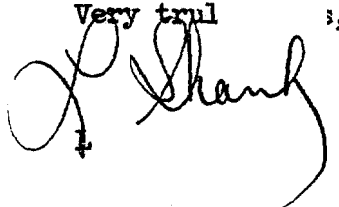
Gentlemen:

Our Mr. R. L. Jordan has reported as follows:

[REDACTED] Deceased ----- Florida Industrial Commission.
1948, the Florida Industrial Commission awarded
\$1,000.00 to the widow of [REDACTED] His Daughter received
\$11.00. She was married four days after her father's death,
therefore, she ceased to be a dependent at that time. The Son,
fifteen years of age, was awarded \$11.00 per week until he
reaches his eighteenth birthday. The Attorneys received \$300.00.
The total awards will amount to \$3,016.00."

The following comments should be noted: Obviously the daughter received the equivalent of one weeks compensation awarded to the boy. i.e., she was a dependent for the major part of one week, hence, received \$11.00 for one weeks compensation. It should also be noted that the \$1,000.00 was paid to the legal wife of [REDACTED] in Atlanta, Georgia. We had previously reported that this legal wife deserted [REDACTED] about six years ago, and has been living as a common-law wife of a negro preacher in Atlanta. Nevertheless, she received the award. The common-law wife of [REDACTED] with whom he has been living in Jacksonville since his legal wife deserted him, did not receive any compensation as she has no legal status.

It is our understanding that the \$3,016.00 will be paid by the Travelers Insurance Company with whom the Pure Oil Company's policy was placed. If our Legal Department is interested in the complete facts regarding this portion of this report, it would be advisable for them to check with the Travelers Insurance Company.
