Dear Mr. Clark,

I received a letter dated November 12th, written by Dr. Kehoe of the University of Cincinnati, in which he says that the box of chewing gum which you sent to the University of Cincinnati for examination was made up of sticks wrapped in a lead foil with paper between the foil and the gum. It is very clear understanding that you had entirely discontinued the use of this lead foil. You cannot continue with this without the risk of risks.

In order to check your gum, we propose to buy samples on the open market from time to time. We find, however, that the boxes are not dated and it would be more satisfactory, both for you and for us, if we could receive from you fresh samples once a week over a period of the next two months. Would you be willing to send a box of gum to Dr. Kehoe once a week, composed of twenty packages chosen at random from the current week's production? He would test these and submit the results to you and to us. If you are not willing to do so, we would, of course, buy the gum on the open market, obtaining the freshest supplies available, but it would not be as satisfactory as if we obtained the samples directly from you.
