Yours of December 3rd was not received until I had already written and dispatched mine of December 4th to Mr. C. J. Stover.

I sent you a copy of my letter to Mr. Stover and you will, therefore, have noted my suggestion to him that he provide copies of Application and Scale of Charges to all members of the asbestos industry and urge their participation.

I have not as yet heard from him but I will advise you of his reply as soon as I am in a position to do so. My feeling is it would be well to have Stover bring the matter to their attention in the first instance and that, thereafter, they be followed by you.
