Dear [REDACTED]

On the REACH Committee meeting of 4 February 2021 you are going to approve the new regulation on C9-C14. I was wondering if we can have a short call before this meeting. We want to reiterate the problem to base the regulation on one manufacturer technology not publically available.

As we indicated the original 400 ppb limit was lowered to 100 ppb based on information shared by one manufacturer claiming that a technology is available to reduce the impurity levels in perfluoroalkoxy-containing fluoropolymers.

This technology was not shared and as of today is referred to as confidential. We did not get answer if this manufacture process used by this one company can be applicable to all manufacturers and all processes. Even one publicly available, other FP manufacturers may need more than three years to assess and implement the technology to their processes.

Let me know if a short call is possible.
