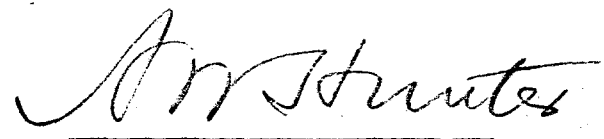
Dear Dr. McKelvie:

I am very much obliged to you for
sending me your observations on Ethyl Gasoline.
I think your letter explains my difficulties.

It was simply this, that other med-
ical men, in a case of a woman found unconscious
at the exhaust of a car in a closed garage, was
thought to have been poisoned more from the
Ethyl content than from the Carbon Monoxide. I
contended that the Carbon Monoxide was the kill-
ing agent and my opinion was disputed.

Your letter clears up the problem very
nicely and I appreciate your help.
