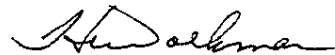

From what we can see, the Spectrographic, Polarographic and Electric Photometer methods are all equally satisfactory. We, of course, can do either one of the three and it was my understanding that Dr. Kehoe would give us the detailed technique of the method that was in use in their laboratory and which they have found the most satisfactory. We actually prefer the polarographic method but we think that it is essential for purposes of having our results checked that we use the same method that is used in the laboratory at the University of Cincinnati.

Would you, therefore, please inform Dr. Kehoe that we can do any of the methods covered in the pamphlet that he has sent us but we wish to know what method he is using and any special details concerning the same."

We sincerely hope that you will give us full information on the preferred method so that they will be able to utilize the material sent and get the program under way.
