three sailors, two seriously, and tied
up traffic on Highway 101 for 40
minutes.
The California Highway Patrol
said the sailors' coupe went out of
control 300 yards south of the
Waldo tunnel. It smashed into
three marker posts, caromed off a
steel fence, turned over, and
skidded 180 feet on its side.
All three sailors were thrown out
and one, Boatswain's Mate Bobbie
P. Conine, 21, was pinned under
the wreckage. He suffered leg and
internal injuries. Ellie J. Wallace,
21, also a boatswain's mate, re-
ceived head and internal injuries.
The driver, Fireman First Class
Shirley R. Carlton, 19, hurt his

back. All three are crewmen of the
USS Kermit Roosevelt, tied up at
Hunters Point.
A 2-year-old San Francisco boy,
John Passalacqua Jr., was seriously
injured in a collision at Oakdale
and Loomis streets last evening. He
was riding with his father, a 22-
year-old clothcutter, when their car
was struck by one driven by
Thomas F. Santiago, 29, of Half
Moon Bay.
Police said the force of the col-
lision swung open the right door
of the Passalacqua auto and it
slammed closed on the youngster's
head. He suffered a crushed jaw.
Santiago was cited for speeding
and faulty brakes.

charge.

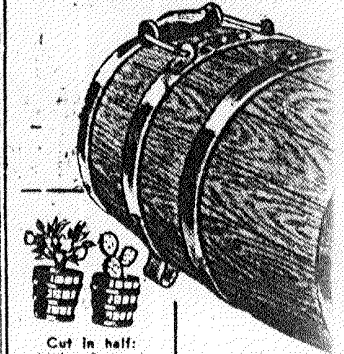
The victim said when she left

turns assaulting her.

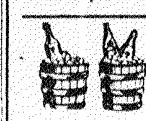
After robbing her of \$28 they

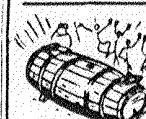
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
