Wenzinger says he believes the underemployment rate and employment will continue about the same the remainder of the year in the state.

"There were 100 complete vineyard units, but there was only a shortage of 500," Wenzinger said. "On just the west of Spencer Williams, administrator of the health and welfare agency, to see what could be done with those on welfare."
