PIONEER WHITE LEAD

Oakland, August 10.—The
district absolutely oppose the use
of automobiles by high school stu-
dents. It was recorded by Mrs.
Ed Ratney and an amendment by
Mrs. Robert Den inserted "indi-
criminate" use of automobiles.
An attempt by Mrs. William
Hayes in the chair to refer the
motion to the resolutions commit-
tee, of which Mrs. W. A. Smith is
chairman, was overruled with the
result that the original motion,
amended, "forbidding the use of
automobiles by high school stu-
dents, except when absolutely
necessary," was unanimously
endorsed by the entire delegation.
They also voted to not only limit
the hours of high school parties,
but to set an example to their
children by "keeping earlier hours
themselves, cutting out the drink-
ing, smoking and the disobedience
of present laws."

SCHOOL CHIEF TALKS.

William J. Cooper, state super-
intendent of public instruction,
gave the address of the morning
upon "Education and Democracy."
"There is no essential difference
between the Republican and Demo-
cratic party," he believes, "and in
the schools of today children are
being taught not to become Demo-
crats or Republicans, but good
citizens."

"Too much book learning and
too little actual character develop-
ment" is his criticism of the pres-
ent educational system in America.
"Americans are all being taught
to be leaders," he said, "and we
have only need for about ten per
cent of our social leaders. That
