If I am not very much mistaken, in writing to Mr. Jenkins some weeks ago I called his attention to the existence of a report issued by the American Public Health Association, the report of the committee of which I had the honor to be chairman, entitled, "Occupational Lead Exposure and Lead Poisoning."
