Mr. Mittnacht is at Wilmington today so I am replying to your letter to him of the 15th relative to Dr. W. E. Brown.

I think you were extremely fortunate in making the arrangement you have with Dr. Brown and can assure you that we will be pleased to indicate our appreciation of his work by the presentation of a check, after it is finished, in such amount as you and I may agree upon as being reasonable. Your recommendation in this respect will be the determining factor, I am sure, as you will be very much better able to accurately judge what would be a "sizeable honorarium".

This reminds me that in view of the patient in the Cannonsburg Hospital it might be a good plan for us to examine a larger proportion of filling station men than originally contemplated. Frankly, these men and the tank wagon drivers appear to me to be fellows who will have the greatest amount of exposure to Ethyl Gasoline.

Mr. Maxwell and I are leaving tonight for Dayton where we are going to have a meeting tomorrow at the Miami Hotel with Mr. Midgley and Mr. Boyd. I hope at that time to complete the booklet that we shortly hope to have printed and distributed to all of our employees and our customers' employees who handle Ethyl, acquainting them with its merits. We anticipate one or two questions and proposed answers for them on health matters, which will be submitted to you before they are incorporated in the booklet. I may call you up from Dayton tomorrow or tomorrow evening for the purpose of submitting such matters to you. However, if I can't get you I will write you from Dayton and you perhaps could have an answer back at New York by the time I get back from Chicago which will probably be on Wednesday next.
