TO MEMBERS OF THE LEAD INDUSTRIES ASSOCIATION, INC.:

RE: 1969 ASSESSABLE TONNAGE

On December 3, 1968, the Board of Directors of LIA will meet to approve the 1969 Budget. At this meeting, the suggestion will be made to change the assessing period from the current calendar year basis (i.e. 1969 assessments based on 1968 tonnage) to the twelve-month period October 1, 1967 thru September 30, 1968. The suggested fiscal base period has been approved by the President of the Association and it is expected that his action will be confirmed by the Board.

This change in the assessment base period will allow members to report their fiscal year's tonnage to us by January 1, 1969 thus enabling us to levy four equal assessments during the year 1969. As was done in 1968, minimum membership assessments, together with membership assessments totaling \$1,000 or less, will be billed annually on July 1, 1969. Pig lead sales and membership assessments in excess of \$1,000 per year will be levied in four equal installments on January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1, 1969.

We therefore, request that you provide us with the necessary figures on the attached questionnaire, one copy of which should be returned to us at your earliest convenience.

It is fully understood that the tonnage reported to the Association is entirely confidential and will be used for assessing purposes only. Your continued cooperation is greatly appreciated.
