Inter-American Safety Council (Consejo Interamericano de Seguridad)

The Inter-American Safety Council was
founded and incorporated in 1938, as a non-
commercial, nonpolitical, and nonprofit edu-
cational association for the prevention of ac-
cidents. It is the Spanish and Portuguese
language counterpart of the National Safety
Council.

The Council is the first and only association
of its kind rendering services to all industries
and agencies in the Latin American countries
and Spain. The objectives are to prevent ac-
cidents—to reduce the number and severity
of accidents in every activity, both on the job
and off the job. The services which the Coun-
cil provides for its members are paid by
membership dues and sales of the Council's
monthly publications and other educational
materials. All of its work is done from the
headquarters in New York.

Membership is opened to all industries,
organizations, institutions, or other groups
with two or more employees, interested in ac-
cident prevention in Latin America and Spain.
Over 1800 plants or work locations in 22
countries are members or are using the ma-
terials and services of the Council. In addi-
tion, over 300 universities, technical schools,
public libraries, and the like, receive the
monthly publications free of charge.

Among the services available to members
are monthly publications, annual contest,
special awards, consultation, statistical serv-
ice, reproduction and translation rights and
participation in the election of Council offi-
cers. In addition, the Council acts as a clear-
ing house of accident prevention materials
available in the United States.

The Council's monthly publications in-
clude two magazines and safety posters.
