California Grows Tallest Children, Psychologist Says

BERKELEY, Calif., April 22 (AP)—After a 20-year study, Dr. Nancy Bayley, child psychologist, has come to this conclusion: Children in California grow taller than in any other state in the union. They average about a inch more in height than those elsewhere.

The reason? The slight change in seasons and availability of fresh fruit and vegetables.

However, she added, Texans may be taller than Californians by maturity since the rate of growth in humans varies widely over the years.

Dr. Bayley made her report at a round table discussion of the University of California Institute of Child Welfare.

State Route Pass Plan Reconsidered

SACRAMENTO, April 22 (UP)—A delegation of Palm Springs officials headed by Mayor Johnny Faircliff the former movie star yesterday persuaded the State Highway Commission to reconsider the proposed routing of a city by-pass of State Route 111.

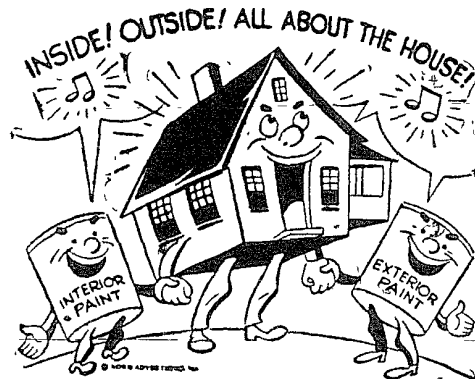
