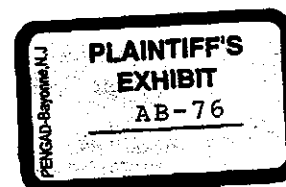

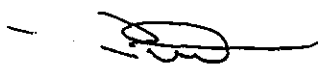
SIDEROSIS
