RE: HEALTH SURVEY

I am in receipt today of your letter
mailed November 1st.

I was indeed glad to hear from you.

I expect to make the Pittsburg trip.
As suggested by your good self and Bill Fenhel I will
surely seek an opportunity of speaking with Colonel Lanza.
Dr. Gardner was glad to hear that you had suggested this
Pittsburg conference to me and intimated strongly that I
should be there.

RE: POSSIBILITIES AT A CLINICAL
DISCUSSION OF ASBESTOSIS BY
RECOGNIZED EXPERTS SHOULD
TAKE PLACE IN THIS PROVINCE

I agree with you fully that, as per
Dr. Gardner's suggestion, Dr. Vestal (Chairman of the North
Carolina Medical Board of the State Industrial Commission)
should be invited. Indeed the standards for X-ray
examination and diagnosis of asbestosis are greatly needed
in this Province.

It seems, may I suggest, that asbestosis
is very seldom a compensable condition of the lungs. At
least, in this Province, I do not believe that asbestosis
at anytime was compensated as a condition which existed
alone. The compensated cases of asbestosis here were
rather cases of asbestosis which came under examination

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when accompanied by or associated with another condition such as tuberculosis, a heart or lung condition, etc. And asbestosis in all these compensated cases was less associated to a condition which was in say disabling.

Should there be any relationship between some degree of diagnosed asbestosis and such other accompanying condition the aspect of "causality" appears to be the crucial one and there proper standards of X-ray examination and diagnosis would be most important to appreciate the coefficient factor of asbestosis (as a causative factor).

RE: CLINIC AT THETFORD MINES

Dr. Cartier has not yet definitely accepted I shall keep you fully informed.

I am looking forward to receiving your plan of an industrial service at Thetford Mines and I am sure the producers there will find same a great help.

" Answering your inquiry I might say that under our Workmen's Compensation law in this Province the patient-claimant has the privilege of retaining his own physician. Up to a few years ago the patient-claimant was subject to treatment by the plant doctor. But the law as it now stands gives the patient-claimant the privilege of securing services by his own physician. At Asbestos, where Canadian Johns-Manville Company Limited are operating, Dr. Stevenson is acting as a company doctor. Moreover, the company is there operating a hospital (in which is situated the clinic you visited the other day) and the hospital is under the direction of Dr. Stevenson, assisted by Dr. Smith. But the patients there may be treated by their own respective physician. As a matter of fact, Dr. Stevenson has always made it a point to direct an employee (whenever an alarming condition or a suspicious condition was disclosed by examination, to his own physician. He thus enjoys the confidence of the local physicians and of the employees as well. "

RE: TUBERCULOSIS X-RAY SURVEYS IN
COMMUNITIES OUTSIDE THE ASBESTOS
INDUSTRY

Dr. Cartier is exactly the physician in charge of the Province of Quebec Anti-Tuberculosis League

at
at Montreal. I am, therefore, communicating to him the views you expressed, at the suggestion of Dr. Gardner, (paragraph 2 of your letter, page 2) re: Sizes of X-ray films, for the general population at Thetford Mines as distinguished to the collectivity of workers engaged into the asbestos industry.

You are right when you state that Dr. Cartier held the same views you expressed in this connection. The regular size films are those which ought to be used for workers (and this has been the practice followed at Asbestos by Canadian Johns-Manville Company Limited - Dr. Stevenson since 1935 at which time Colonel Lanza and Dr. Gardner made suggestions in connection with the setting-up of an X-ray clinic there.

I shall keep you fully informed and only too glad to take up with you at anytime any point which may arise, the whole as suggested by you (paragraph 2 of page 2 of your letter).

Thank you for the two reprints and your report on your trip to Montreal, Asbestos, Thetford Mines, Quebec, October 16th - October 26th, 1944.
