ASBESTOS BILL INTRODUCED

On February 6, 1978, Senator Robert Presley of Riverside-San Bernardino introduced the following bill as described by the Legislative Counsel's Digest:

"SB1491, as introduced, Presley. Asbestos.

Existing law prohibits spraying of any product containing asbestos in or upon a building or other structure during its construction, alteration, or repair. Existing law exempts, until July 1, 1978, specified encapsulated asbestos products and Portland cement plaster of less than one-half of 1 percent asbestos.

This bill would remove such exemption termination date and further define encapsulated products exempted to those which contain asbestos fibers bound within the finished product from manufacture through application such that during any reasonably foreseeable use, spraying, application, handling, storage, repair, disposal, processing, or transportation, no airborne concentration of asbestos will be released in excess of specified exposure limits.

The bill would take effect immediately as an urgency statute."

If this bill does not become law by July 1, 1978, the use of asbestos containing cement in Portland cement plaster will be prohibited.

Members of the Senate Health & Welfare Committee who will hear this bill initially are: Arlen Gregorio, San Mateo, Chairman; John Garamendi, Stockton, Vice Chairman; William Campbell, Los Angeles; Paul Carpenter, Orange; Alex Garcia, Los Angeles; Nate Holden, Los Angeles; Milton Marks, San Francisco; John Najedly, Contra Costa; and Robert Presley, Riverside.

The first hearing for this bill has been tentatively set for Wednesday, March 15, 1978.

If you have a close relationship with any of the committee members, your recommendation urging passage of SB1491 would be quite helpful.

We will keep you advised of this bill as it works its way through the legislative process -- and hopefully to passage into law.

The registration fee for the entire conference is only \$100.00, which includes meals, conference materials, honorariums, etc.

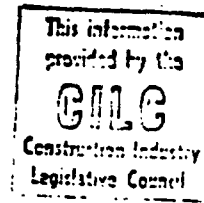

An act to amend Section 25910 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to asbestos, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1491, as introduced, Presley. Asbestos.

Existing law prohibits spraying of any product containing asbestos in or upon a building or other structure during its construction, alteration, or repair. Existing law exempts, until July 1, 1973, specified encapsulated asbestos products and Portland cement plaster of less than one-half of 1 percent asbestos.

This bill would remove such exemption termination date and further define encapsulated products exempted to those which contain asbestos fibers bound within the finished product from manufacture through application such that during any reasonably foreseeable use, spraying, application, handling, storage, repair, disposal, processing, or transportation, no airborne concentration of asbestos will be released in excess of specified exposure limits.

The bill would take effect immediately as an urgency statute.

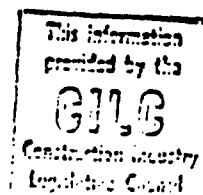

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 25910 of the Health and Safety Code is amended to read:

25910. (a) ~~Except as provided in subdivision (b),~~ no person, on or after July 1, 1975, shall cause or permit the spraying of any substance containing more than one-half of 1 percent asbestos in or upon a building or other structure during its construction, alteration, or repair. Except as provided in subdivisions subdivisions (b) and (c), no person, on or after July 1, 1976, shall cause or permit the spraying of any substance containing any amount of asbestos in or upon a building or other structure during its construction, alteration, or repair.

(b) Portland cement plaster containing less than one-half of 1 percent asbestos, and exterior and interior coatings and laminating resins containing encapsulated asbestos fibers bound within the finished product from manufacture through application, shall be exempt from the provisions of this chapter until July 1, 1978. Cold process cutback asphalt roof coatings shall be exempt from the provisions of this chapter.

(c) Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 6 (commencing with Section 140) of Division 1 of the Labor

Code, the Occupational Safety and Health Standards Board may exempt from the provisions of this chapter any substance which contains less than one-quarter of 1 percent asbestos which occurs solely as a result of naturally occurring impurities in the substance or its components.

SEC. 2. This act is an urgency statute necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety within the meaning of Article IV of the Constitution and shall go into immediate effect. The facts constituting such necessity are:

In order that the changes made by this act may take effect prior to July 1, 1978, and at the earliest opportunity during the construction season, it is necessary that this act take immediate effect.

An act to amend Section 25910 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to asbestos, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1591, as introduced, Marks. Asbestos: buildings and structures.

Existing law prohibits any person, on and after July 1, 1973, from spraying any substance containing more than $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1% asbestos in or upon a building or other structure during its construction, alteration, or repair and, on or after July 1, 1976, prohibits such spraying of any substance containing any amount of asbestos. Excepted from such prohibition are cold process cutback asphalt roof coatings and, until July 1, 1978, Portland cement plaster containing less than $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1% asbestos and exterior and interior coatings and laminating resins containing encapsulated asbestos fibers bound within the finished product from manufacture through application.

This bill would authorize the Occupational Safety and Health Standards Board to exempt from such prohibition any substance which contains less than $\frac{1}{4}$ of 1% asbestos occurring solely as a natural impurity in the substance or its components.

The bill would also make technical, conforming changes.

The bill would take effect immediately as an urgency statute.
