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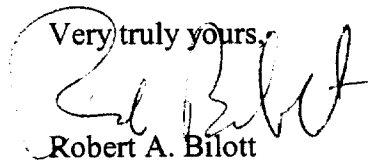

As a Defendant in a class action lawsuit pending against DuPont in the West Virginia State Court in which we serve as Class counsel, DuPont also has the right to mark documents produced in that case as falling under the terms of a Stipulated Protective Order that allow parties to limit distribution of documents, if they qualify as documents for which "Confidential Business Information" (CBI), protection would be available under, among other provisions, 40 C.F.R. Part 2, Subpart B. None of the enclosed documents have been stamped "confidential" by DuPont under the terms of that Stipulated Protective Order.
