Dear Oscar,

A short time ago, I wrote you concerning a health case which was reported to us by the Wofford Oil Company in Birmingham, Alabama.

Since that time, George Posser, being in Birmingham on other business, has been able to discuss this subject in greater detail with Wofford's Mr. Lord and apparently, neither Mr. Lord nor his Company is particularly disturbed over the complaint. The claim which faces them has now been placed in the hands of a local lawyer who states there is no real justification in same. The reference to lead poisoning has been traced to the diagnosis of a doctor in Selma, Alabama, and should this individual care to stress the handling of lead gasolines, there may be some reason for us to follow the matter further and report our findings to Dr. Kehoe. In the meantime, however, we have suggested to Mr. Lord that should this Doctor desire information regarding the affliction of his patient, it might be in order to address such inquiry to our Dr. Kehoe who I am sure would be very pleased to offer suggestions and advice.

As the case now stands, there does not seem to be any great need for concern on our part- in fact, I am under the impression that it will soon be a closed matter.
