

A Three-Day Check Test

Walter Kelsey of the Roosevelt Rifle Club, New York, recently made the following check test on an outdoor range: ten targets prone, ten shots on each target at fifty yards; two targets, ten shots on each with a machine rest at the same distance.

The shooting was done on three different days which means different wind, different temperature, different conditions. Every shot fired counted, as there were no sighters. His equipment was a .22 Springfield rifle, Fecker scope, and US .22 N. R. A. long rifle cartridges.

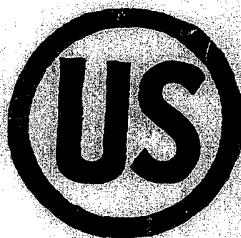
The results of Mr. Kelsey's three-day test are shown in the above half-sized reproductions of his targets. The two smaller targets are those made in the machine rest. Mr. Kelsey stated that he was able to call every shot within half an inch and could cover every group with a one-inch disk.

Test US .22 N. R. A.'s yourself. Shoot 'em in every position. Shoot 'em in a machine rest. Their uniform grouping will convince you, as it has thousands of others, that "they hit where you aim."

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
