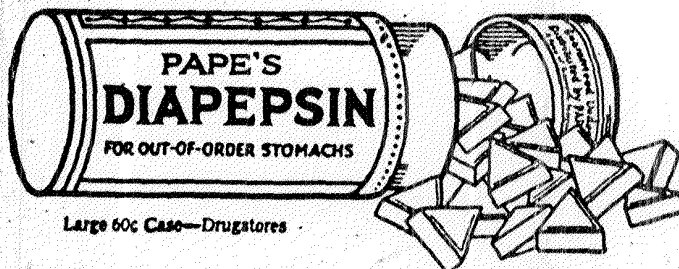

BERKELEY, Oct. 16.—The Department of Education of the University of California is giving consideration to a plan advanced by the Government Savings Organization for the development of the Twelfth Federal Reserve district for the development of in personal budget making of the school students as part work in Americanization and ship.
