swift motion. The experiments, completely successful, were the forerunners of the real motion picture development known today and revolutionized the art of depicting animals in motion in paint and bronze.
The pictures taken by the photographer Muybridge were the first in the world representing an accurate record of motion in motion. In his experiments Muybridge placed a number of cameras in line to obtain a succession of repeated exposures. The shutters of the long line of cameras were operated by means of a thread stretched in the moving animal's path. In addition to the Stanford farm at Palo Alto the old race track at Sacramento was used by Muybridge.
FUTURE IN EUROPE
Professor Walter R. Miles, Stanford psychologist, who has made a special study of the Muybridge photographic experiments and their history, declared today that the man primarily to be credited with the achievement of first recording continuous action, motion pictures, is Governor Leland Stanford, who made the Muybridge experiments possible.
In addresses at Wednesday's exercises the fact was stressed that the first successful experiments in photographing motion were made in California, the State that now produces 90 per cent of motion pictures.

Cooley's Son to Face Murder Quiz

LOS ANGELES, May 5 (AP)—An asserted feud between three persons closely connected with Victor A. Cooley, Pasadena, automobile rental dealer, who was slain by John H. Howard, his roommate, came under the scrutiny of county investigators tonight in their effort to discover the real motive for the killing.
Howard, who was held on a murder complaint, confessed he struck the blow with a mechanic's hammer April 18 which caused Cooley's death "because of an argument over liquor."
Clyde Cooley, 18, son of the slain man, will be questioned by Wayne Jordan, Assistant District Attorney, in connection with the new turn in the investigation.
Young Cooley will be called to the District Attorney's office early tomorrow, and later six men known to have been Cooley's associates will be questioned.
