I have forwarded the letter continuing the agreement for another year, to the University Board. No doubt it will be acted upon early in May.

Is it to be merely a trial of the equipment by the jobbers, themselves, with the distinct understanding that they are not to try to extend the use of the material and equipment? Or will they create the same problems for you in the near future that other enthusiastic proponents have made? You should examine not only your own intentions in this matter, but also the probable reactions of this group of agents, before you decide whether or not to go ahead on this project.
