RED CROSS FLOOD RELIEF REACHES \$28,000 TOTAL

When San Diego Red Cross headquarters closed yesterday evening, Gen. Joseph E. Kuhn, chairman, reported that this city's flood relief contribution had passed \$28,000, 40 percent in excess of the assigned quota.

"A wonderful tribute to the spirit of children in meeting calls of distress is revealed by the voluntary action of the Junior Red Cross of San Diego's schools," Gen. Kuhn said. "Without any suggestion from the San Diego chapter of the Red Cross the Junior Red Cross voted at its last monthly meeting to take up a 'penny collection' in each of the city schools for the benefit of the flood sufferers. Final returns from 32 participating schools showed a total of \$895.44 contributed by the children in pennies, nickels and dimes.

"Other donations gratefully acknowledged are: San Diego Women's club, \$50; La Mode, proceeds of benefit sale, \$20; La Mesa Heights, additional, \$45.

"Among La Mesa Heights' contributors is Master Richard Grau, 7 year old, who donated his entire allowance of 70 cents, accompanied by a legible note in his own handwriting. The Red Cross thanks Master Richard for his generosity and congratulates him on his fine spirit."
