Business Activity In Stockton Grows

STOCKTON, April 7.—Healthy business increases in Stockton last March as compared to March of 1935 are indicated by representative indices during the last month. Bank clearings were \$7,456,000 as compared to \$5,797,000 a year ago, an increase of 28 per cent; bank debits were \$17,414,000 as against \$14,154,000 in March, 1935, and increase of 23 per cent; building permits cost were \$123,207 as compared with \$50,005 last March, a 145 per cent gain; and postal receipts increased from \$26,910 to \$27,821.
