Dear Doctor:-

Your letter of the 7th clears up the proposition to our full satisfaction. If Dr. Ashe will carry on any discussion resulting from questions along the lines of the general statement that you enclosed, we certainly can offer no objections to such a procedure. We did not have in mind the necessity of Dr. Ashe confining his answers to questions to a pre-arranged schedule. We simply wanted the talk to be in such a form that we could refer to it in the future in order to settle some point should a discussion concerning it arise.

We will follow your suggestion and have a stenographer present at the meeting so that a complete record can be made of the questions and also of the answers.

We want to avoid at all hazards any semblance of a pre-arranged conference because we do not wish to do anything that could arouse suspicion that we had anything to hide from our employees as to the working conditions of our plant.

On the other hand we do not want to unduly emphasize the hazards we have which, as you bring out so nicely in your letter, are no greater and in most cases less than hazards in other plants in comparable industries.

Just as soon as we can make our plans we will get in touch with Dr. Ashe and advise him a few days in advance of when we will have the meeting. Just when that will be it is rather difficult for us to say because right now we are pretty well tied up with the Federal Trade Commission in answering a citation which they made against us some time ago.
