Cinerarias planted from seed
now will bloom in the early
spring. A mixture of sand and
screened leaf mold in equal
parts is satisfactory for the start-
ing flat. When the second pair
of leaves have been developed
by the small plants, they may be
transplanted into a second flat.
A mixture of two parts leaf
mold, one part sand and four
parts soil should be used in this
flat with a little bone meal ad-
ded. Remove the plants to flow-
er pots or set in the open
ground when they are about
three inches in height.

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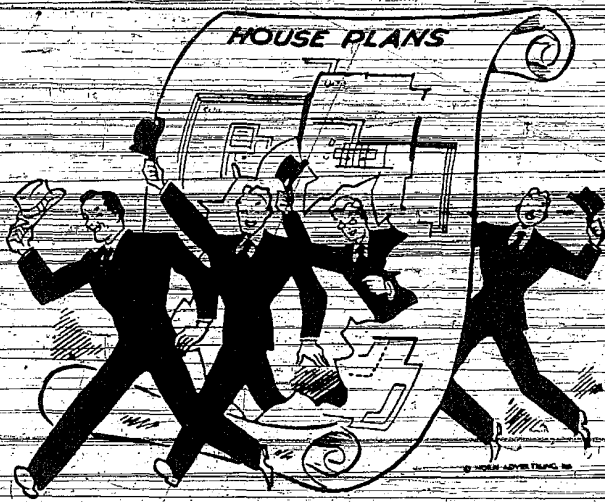
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
