I received a copy of your 17 April E-Mail to D. Branton concerning the alleged illness of Bobbie Rainer. At this time the most important thing we can do is document the incident and collect all of the information pertaining to the November 1980 work activity that allegedly caused the illness.

On review of your E-Mail two employees were held over to blow off dust that had accumulated on Unit #1 joints and alleged asbestos fibers were present in the dust that caused the employee to become ill. I suggest the following actions:

1. o Terry prepare a Westinghouse incident and illness report (Form 84-12) describing the "alleged" incident. Send to me and I will communicate with our insurance carrier.
2. o Interview and obtain statements, from all personnel who had knowledge of the incident in November and forward to me.
3. o Westinghouse protected eight material samples from the job site and some of the samples contained asbestos fibers. Westinghouse needs to validate if any of the dust that B. Rainer cleaned off contained asbestos fibers. Have ever materials were used to produce the dust on the joints and are they available today for testing?
4. o Did the two employees, Ed Williams and B. Rainer wear a respirator, paper clothing or any personal protective equipment while they were blowing down the joints? What was the air pressure? What type of air nozzle were the employees using during the cleaning process? How would you describe the dust generated from the blow down, heavy, light etc.? How large an area were the employees cleaning? Could you provide a sketch showing the area the employees were cleaning.
5. o Did Ed Williams experience any medical problems following the November blow down cleaning activity.
6. o Westinghouse would also appreciate any documents, papers, minutes from the 4-18-81 meeting with TVA, State of Tenn. Environmental Specialist and T. Perkins.

Since the work activity that the alleged claim is based was November 1980, we understand it will be difficult to obtain all of the

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information. We ask that you take the time necessary to collect the information now since this claim could materialize later and the longer we delay the data collection the more difficult it becomes.
