Dear Mr. Tulloch:

I have rewritten the list of licensed materials adding a heading to it and incorporating Mr. Steffens changes and also slight changes of my own and enclose herewith two copies for your consideration. As soon as we arrive at the final form of the schedules, I will be prepared to give my final report to Mr. Crabbs on this proposed license.

It is my understanding that the list of licensed materials to be attached to the license granted to a manufacturer will include all ten classes and that the license to be granted to other licensees will only have a limited number of these classes, depending upon the character of the licensee. For instance, if the licensee is only to wind the covers coming within classes 1 and 2, the list attached to such licensee's license will contain only classes 1 and 2, and should you have some licensee who, we will say, only made corrugated asbestos paper, but did not make the finished pipe covering, such licensee would only have class 3 attached to

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his license. By following this plan we should be able to confine the various classes of licensees to the materials coming within their class. This, of course, means that you will have to have separate lists for each class of licensee. This also applies to your schedule of prices, as, of course, there is no need of attaching to a winders license any prices, terms and conditions of sale on corrugated asbestos paper.
