ACGIH was organized in 1938 by a group of governmental industrial hygienists as a medium for the exchange of ideas, experiences, and the promotion of standards and techniques in occupational health.

ACGIH's wide scope of activities are accomplished through the work of its standing committees, of which there are now 15, plus five ad hoc committees, and six joint committees with the American Industrial Hygiene Association. Particularly valuable to safety professionals is *Industrial Ventilation—A Manual of Recommended Practice*, by the committee on industrial ventilation.

ACGIH publishes annually a table of recommended threshold limits (The 1968 table is published in Chapter 42 of this Manual). A list of publications will be sent on request to ACGIH.

The AIHA is a professional association composed of industrial hygiene personnel. Requirements for membership are a college degree and three years of industrial hygiene experience.
