On going over my notes on my examination of you on Saturday, and on examining the blood smears which I brought back with me, I am impressed by the desirability of making a further and more careful study of your condition. I have written to Dr. Hildreth today stating this and stating my reasons for this feeling. I would suggest that you consult Dr. Hildreth on the matter, and that if it meets with his approval I would like very much to have you come to Cincinnati and spend several days in the hospital here in order that we may make the necessary studies to arrive at a conclusion and see what we can do for you. If you are agreeable to this, I will make arrangements to have you brought to Cincinnati by automobile, and you will be kept in the hospital for a number of days, at no expense to yourself. We will be glad also, to return you to your home.

For your stay in the hospital you will need to bring along such articles of clothing as you would use at home, and such toilet equipment as you ordinarily use. All other things will be provided for you.

I am especially interested in having the opinion and advice of one of my colleagues here in Cincinnati who has had much more experience and who knows much more about these matters than I, both as to diagnosis and treatment. I hope therefore, that you will find it possible to come. I will get in touch with you later as to the exact day on which we can arrange to pick you up.
