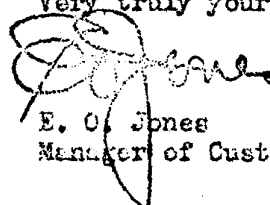
Dear Mr. Jacques:

We have your letter of April 28 inquiring as to our ability to supply a 55-gallon drum of iso-octane containing tetraethyl lead in the amount of 6 cubic centimeters per gallon. Unfortunately we are not in the position to supply this material.

We should like to call to your attention that any fuel, whether gasoline or iso-octane, has a commercial limitation of 4.6 cubic centimeters of tetraethyl lead per gallon when such fuel is to be used in aviation engines. This regulation has been established by the United States Public Health Service.

If you have in mind using this material for experimental purposes, we shall be pleased to have you write to us in greater detail and to render whatever assistance we can.
