2 MR. IGNATOWSKI: Kaylo dust on inhalation
3 by experimental animals does not produce silicosis
4 irrespective of the small amount of quartz present.

5 It does produce the asbestotic-type of
6 reaction in the lungs and, therefore, we believe every
7 precaution should be taken to minimize exposure to
8 industrial employees.

9 MS. TOSTANOSKI: I want to read the second
10 to the last paragraph.

11 This evidence would support the view that
12 inhalation of Kaylo dust would not be hazardous from
13 the standpoint of tuberculosis, especially provided
14 that the dust hazard is controlled as cited above.

15 MR. IGNATOWSKI: Next is Number 26, interim
16 report regarding the biological activity of Kaylo dust
17 to the Owens-Illinois Glass Company by the Saranac
18 Laboratory, Saranac Lake, New York, October 30th,
19 1948, submitted by Arthur J. Vorwald, M.D., Director
