ONLY ONE DAY LEFT FOR FARM TRUCK REGISTRATION

Every Ventura county farmer who operates a truck or who drives a pickup today had one day left—tomorrow—for a job he must do if he expects to continue operation of the vehicle after Nov. 15.

The job is to file an application for an office of defense transportation certificate of war necessity and unless the application is filed, the farmer may find himself without means of buying rationed gasoline.

REGISTRATION POINTS—B. D. Laubacher, chairman of the farm transportation committee of the USDA, was heard reported a corps of workers ready to assist the farmers and other truckers engaged in hauling farm goods to complete the ODT application forms by Oct. 24.

Registration headquarters have been established at the Farm Bureau office, 52 N. California street, Ventura; the city hall, Ojai; the agricultural commission office, Santa Paula; Moorpark union high school; Fillmore union high school and the Oxnard Chamber of Commerce office, all of them open until 5 p.m. today and tomorrow.

RECORDS NEEDED—"Information which farmers should have to complete the application includes all records which indicate the mileage traveled, commodities and tonnage hauled and gasoline used in the applicant's truck during 1941 and 1942," Laubacher said.

MOVIE SHOWS LOCAL HISTORY

The days when Ventura county's old Creek ran can be seen in the story of the county and its people about where Camp Comfort is now and how the scenery looked to Northcott-Ventura stage passengers 25 years ago are featured today for posterity at a film in the Ventura county pioneer museum.

But whether posterity ever see the reel, made in 1917, is doubtful, depending on whether a projector can be found about the first of November.

Ezra A. Bunka was used to run the stage from Ojai when it was still Northcott-Ventura. He owned the moving picture, apparently made as an attraction show. Mrs. William Peters, his mother-in-law, gave it to the museum.

From what J. H. Morrison, curator of the museum, has ascertained without benefit of projection, the film shows an ancient stage starting out on the road to Ojai, the scenery from here to Ojai as stage passengers used to see it.

Three Civil War Flags Now on Display At Pioneer Museum

Three flags under which the 10th Ohio volunteers fought in the Union in the Civil War today were on display in the Ventura County Pioneer museum, selected from the first by C. H. D. Hines, first Ventura county superior court judge.

Badly frayed after nearly 80 years, the flags have 24 stars, according to Curator J. H. Morrison. Two are apparently guidons with V-cusons, while the third is a field standard with the long way of the flag running parallel to the pole. Its stars are in six rows of five and one row of four; the guidons' stars are in three rows.

Mr. and Mrs. E. B. Hall, former Venturans, gave the flags to the museum. They presented also a kit of Knights Templars regalia belonging at the time to his father, the late E. S. Hall, included are hats, belts and leather cuffs as well as a program of Easter proceedings in 1892.

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U.S. Troops Standing Up Well Under Indian Climate, Says General

NEW DELHI—American troops are standing up well under India's tropical and semitropical climate and the rate of hospital admissions is about the same as that for forces in the United States, Brig. Gen. Harrison L. Beebe, commander of U. S. forces in China, Burma and India, reported today.

There have been 24 cases of heat prostration, four of them fatal, Beebe said. There have been a few cases of dysentery, malaria, and sand fly fevers and a little venereal disease, the general added.
