I would appreciate it if you would send me reprints of your various articles on lead poisoning. I have just analyzed tissues from infant who chewed paint off his crib. with the following results.

Liver 2.84 mg/100 gms.

Kidney 6.34 mg/100 gms

Brain 0.378 mg/100 gms.

It is interesting to note the different distribution that we obtained from that due to colloidal lead as you found it in your cases, where the liver contained the greatest concentrations. The brain contained relatively small amounts.
