The first two claims are both scheduled to be heard before
the Bureau in Cincinnati on February 10, 1961, at 1:15 p.m. on the question
allowing a death award to the widows or dependents.

We have discussed the claims at considerable length and have
sent you numerous reports on the questions posed by these three claims, and we
believe that you would want your counsel, Mr. Obenshain, to attend these
hearings so that he will be familiar with the claims and can determine whether
there is any basis for petitioning the Commission for relief in these claims
under the handicapped employee classification.

As was mentioned during my discussion with your managers
during my recent visit, these are the three most costly claims that have been
charged against your experience in recent years and similar claims will un-
doubtedly arise in future years.

We would appreciate receiving a copy of your counsel's re-
port and will be glad to provide him with any additional information or
assistance that would be helpful.
