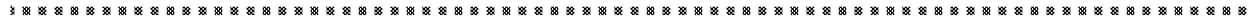

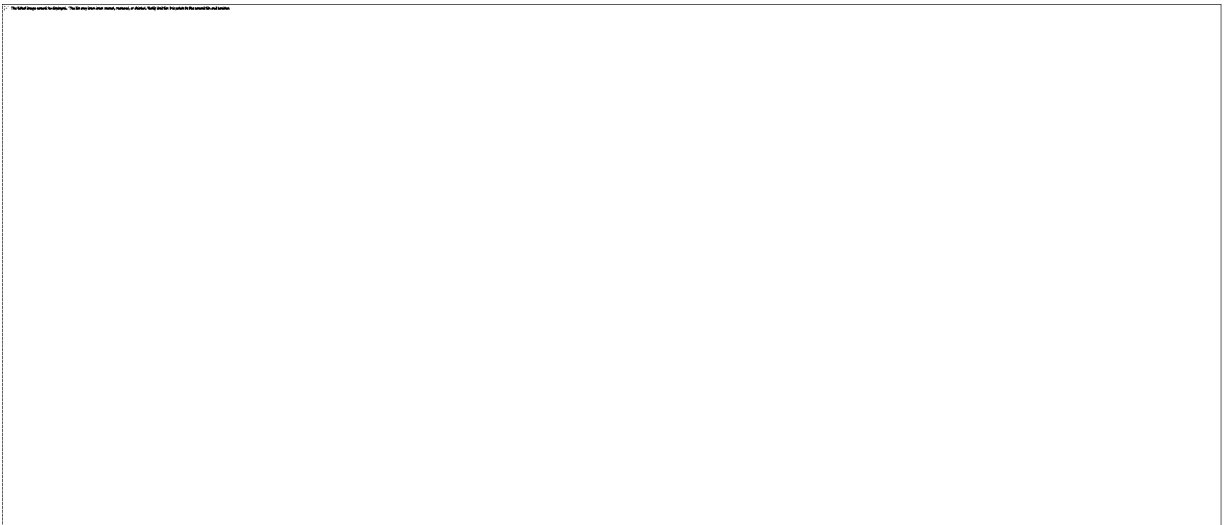
### 2017 Electricity Price Map

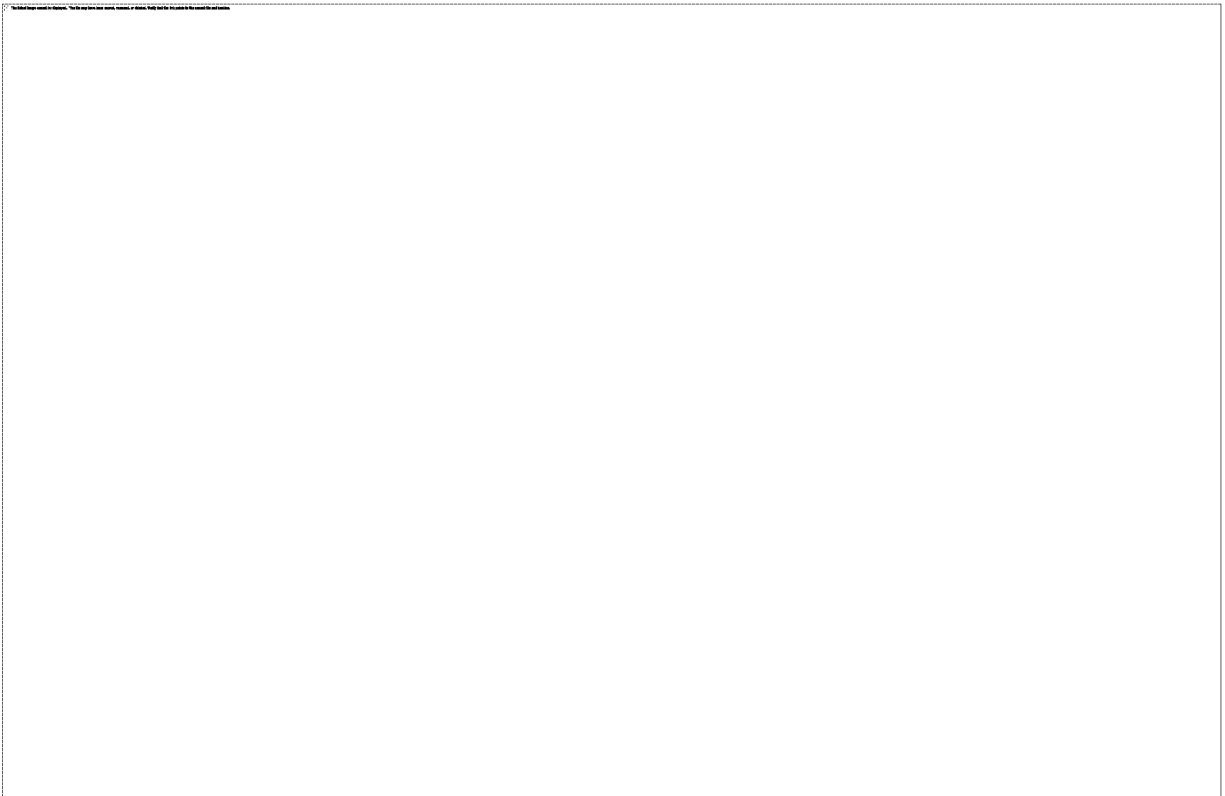

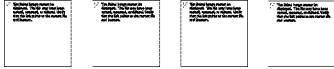
## On the Road
