Mr. [REDACTED] whom we saw here in New York on 28 April 1947 in reference to his own suspicion of lead intoxication, stopped in the office on the 25th of March of his own accord.

Since his last visit he has continued in the same work, wearing a respirator and protective clothing, and has been symptom free. For several days last year he neglected to wear a respirator and noted return of malaise, forgetfulness, and numbness in his right arm. Symptoms subsided when respirator was again used.
