This will acknowledge your letter of the twenty-sixth. We had some of these cartons prepared some time ago for shipments of material from the mines and there was a change in size over what we originally started with. I am not sure that we have any of these left but if we do, I shall have them forwarded to you as you have requested, sending them to East Broughton. I shall know about this in a few days and will advise you.

Another matter that I would like to mention before closing is that I wired Mr. Crabbs some time ago asking for cooperation on a price schedule for flexible jackets. I know that if we could get your cooperation on this we could have Keasbey & Mattison take out a License and maintain a price schedule, which they are not now doing. At the present time they are quoting utilities a ridiculous price and it is going to be necessary for us to place in the field a jacket to compete with this or else have them cooperate with us.

It seems that you are aware that this matter has been turned over to Tulloch and I have only been trying to help him get a decision on this for it seems that it is not possible to get a favorable decision from the Carey Company. I wish it could be done; it would mean that we could all enjoy a profit on one of the larger users of this material. Use your best influence and see what you can accomplish.
