Dear Mr. Laham:

During our discussion in your office on April 23, 1975, as well as in previous discussions with Monsanto representatives, we reviewed the currently acceptable applications for polychlorinated biphenyls and the proper methods for disposal of scrap material.

Samples of the polychlorinated biphenyls from your friend's inventory were analyzed and were found to be contaminated and not reclaimable for approved dielectric use. To eliminate any potential opportunity for this material to become an environmental pollutant I strongly recommend proper disposal by high temperature incineration.

During our discussion relating to the cost of disposal I indicated that in my opinion Monsanto should not be expected to pay for the disposal of material which belonged to others. However, as an indication of our interest in the proper disposal of polychlorinated biphenyls, I suggest that the owner of the scrap PCBs propose to Monsanto Company by return mail a plan for disposal by incineration with Monsanto sharing some of the costs.

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I hope I have conveyed to you the importance of taking prompt responsible action to properly dispose of this material. I look forward to a response from your friend soon.
