Many thanks for the covering letter on the DDT report.

I dare say some action will be forthcoming on the report to the API, although as a committee they are likely to move slowly. It strikes me as a trifle odd that they do not have a full time coordinator for their toxicological work in view of its scope and distribution.

Nothing has yet arisen to affect our understandings and relationships and I hope to see you before too long to give you a fill-in on the present set-up. My responsibilities center largely around problems of mobilization and assignment of scientific personnel in which field we are moving ahead slowly. Our progress naturally is greatly affected by the status of the war and public attitude on mobilization.
